Freestyle Ice Guidelines
2021-22 Season – Welcome Skaters!
Updated 7-15-2021

Welcome to the Glenview Community Ice Center! Freestyle ice is for skater's level **Bronze Free Skate (Free Skate 1 and up)** who want to independently practice their skills, routines or take private lessons. Skaters at levels below Bronze Free Skate are not permitted skate on the session independently and are required to be accompanied by a coach in a private lesson for the entire length of their session.

Low Freestyle: Skaters at levels Basic 2 through Silver Free Skate (Free Skate 4) are permitted to skate independently on scheduled low freestyle sessions.

In order to ensure that you have a safe, productive and fun experience at the Ice Center we ask that you read the following guidelines carefully and thank you for your cooperation. The above level breakdown for Freestyle and Low Freestyle ice are subject to change at the Director's discretion if changes are needed to ensure safety for all.

Freestyle Ice Priority Registration

Freestyle ice purchase is sold on a monthly basis using the on-line registration system. Walk-in registration is permitted based on availability, please check the on-line registration system before attempting to walk-in. Skaters register for ice using the following priority system – see classifications below:

1. Glenview Residents, Monday at 7am the week registration opens
2. Glenview Skater, Wednesday at 7am the week registration opens
3. Non-residents, new skaters, Friday at 7am the week registration opens

Glenview Residents: Living within the Glenview Park District boundaries.

Glenview Skaters: Skaters that have participated in Glenview Ice Center classes and programs (Glenview Skating Academy, Glenview Blades) and who bought freestyle ice at the Ice Center in the 2019-20 seasons.

Non-Residents, new skaters: Skaters living outside the Glenview Park District boundaries, skaters who have not skated at the Glenview Ice Center or who skated at the Ice Center prior to 2019.

Monthly Registration Schedule

Freestyle ice registration opens the 2nd or 3rd Monday of each prior month, registration follows the schedule above for each group and then is open for all skaters starting Friday at 7am.

Registration closes when a freestyle session is full. Maximum capacity for each session is 22 skaters. Ice time fees for all Rink A / B Freestyle sessions are \$7 for 30 minutes. Studio Rink Low Freestyle sessions are \$5 for 30 minutes.

Refunds/Transfers on Unfilled Sessions

Refunds and transfers are permitted on unfilled freestyle sessions for health, scheduling, etc. with 48 hours' notice. Contact Kathy Brickman to complete your refund/transfer.

Refunds/Transfers on Filled Sessions

Only transfers to other freestyle ice times are permitted with 48 hours' notice. Refunds are only issued for medical reasons with a doctor's note or a death in the family. For additional information, contact Kathy Brickman.

No shows – NO credits issued for no shows

Skaters who do not show up for a scheduled session timeslot will be considered a no show. No shows will not be refunded, transferred, or given a credit.

Partner Work

No partner work is permitted on freestyle sessions including ice dance, pair skating or synchro skating.

Semi-Private Lessons – Group Lessons

Freestyle ice time is for private – one on one lessons only. Semi-private lessons (2 skaters) or group lessons (3+ skaters) are not permitted on freestyle ice.

Semi-private lessons (2 skaters) are permitted on **Low Freestyle ice sessions only**.

Group lessons (3+ skaters) are not permitted on freestyle or low freestyle sessions.

Ice Dance

Solo ice dance levels Bronze or lower is permitted on freestyle ice at the discretion of Kathy Brickman. Ice dance coaches must contact Kathy before scheduling lessons.

Music

The Glenview Community Ice Center is equipped with auxiliary input, Bluetooth connectivity and a CD player. Music is to be played on the honor system with skaters forming a line at the start of each session and taking turns playing their music. Coaches are permitted one cut in line per lesson. Music should not be restarted if there is a line of music to be played. Skaters must wear a belt while music is being played and skaters skating to music have the right of way. When needed, coaches and skaters should utilize the white board at center ice for music queuing.

Freestyle Ice Programming Guidelines – Ice Etiquette Safety Guidelines

All participants and their parents must agree to abide by the Freestyle Ice Programming Guidelines and Ice Etiquette and Safety rules. Coaches Compliance

All coaches teaching private lessons at the Ice Center must provide Skating Director, Candace Diaz, proof of their coaching compliance for the current season prior to scheduling any lessons at the Ice Center.
